Dear Parents,

Arrangements for the resumption of face-to-face classes after the school's Easter holiday

The Education Bureau (EDB) announced on 11 April 2022 that schools will resume classes after the Easter holiday, and all secondary schools in Hong Kong can resume half-day face-to-face classes in phases starting from 3 May after the completion of the core subjects of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination. The specific arrangements for the recommendations are as follows:

1. Classroom arrangements for Secondary 1 to Secondary 5

Starting from 19 April (Tuesday), the class schedule for all levels is shown as follows:

2. Going back to school to collect learning materials

Students are requested to wear neat summer school uniforms and return to school according to the following dates and times to collect learning materials.

3. Regular Rapid Antigen Tests

In response to the requirements of the Education Bureau, all staff and students of the school must complete a rapid antigen test before returning to school every day. The test should be carried out every morning, and the relevant persons can only return to work/class after obtaining a negative result. If the test result is positive, they are not allowed to return to school, and should notify the school and report to the Department of Health as soon as possible and stay at home. Students must report the test results on time as instructed before returning to school.

According to EDB, schools can randomly check cases and ask students to review (schools provide test kits for students to conduct tests on their own). If the parents do not agree to the rapid antigen test review for your children, please notify the school in writing before 3 May. If the test is not completed in time and the student cannot attend class, the school will notify the parents and arrange the student to go home as soon as possible.

4. **Exam Score Weight Revision**

Due to the special holiday in March, the Mid-Term Examination will be cancelled, and the grades for S1 to S5 will be 50% of the previous semester's examination. 50% of the next semester exam will be calculated.

5. **Exams for next semester postponed**

The next semester exams, originally scheduled to start on 1 June, will be postponed to 4 July to 14 July. Parents and students can browse the latest school calendar on the school website.

6. **Change to summer uniforms**

As the weather gradually warms up, starting from 3 May (Tuesday), all students must return to school in full summer uniforms. Due to the epidemic, students can wear sports uniforms (T-shirt + trousers) to school on days when there are physical education classes, and avoid gathering in the locker room.

7. **Cancellation of Athletic Meet**

Due to the prolonged outbreak of the epidemic, large-scale events should not be held at this stage to avoid crowds gathering and increasing the risk of virus transmission. Our school will cancel the athletic meet originally scheduled on 16 May, and the school will follow the original Monday schedule on that day. Parents and students are advised to pay attention.

8. **Cancellation of PTA membership fees for this academic year**

In view of the spread of the novel coronavirus, in order to reduce the burden on parents, our school has decided to waive the PTA membership fees for this school year.

9. **"Vaccine Pass" Arrangement**

The "Vaccine Pass" has been implemented in all schools from 24 February 2022 and is applicable to teaching and non-teaching staff, those providing services on campus and visitors. The government announced on 20 March 2022 that it will adjust the vaccination requirements for the "Vaccine Pass" (including the third dose of vaccine). Schools must make corresponding arrangements in accordance with the relevant requirements. Please refer to Annex 2 for details.

The above "Vaccine Pass" arrangement does not apply to our school students, persons under the age of 12, parents or guardians accompanying students to the school for vaccinations or in-person vaccinations, and visitors to activities as students¹.

Note:

- For those who have only received the CoronaVac (Sinovac) or the Comirnaty (BioNTech) vaccines outside Hong Kong, their eligibility for Vaccine Pass should follow the requirements in the above Annex. In other cases, a person who received a "full course" COVID-19 vaccination outside Hong Kong will be deemed to have fulfilled the requirement for the 2nd dose, provided that the vaccine is on the list of recognised vaccines ("the List") on the Government's COVID-19 Thematic Website (https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/pdf/list_of_recognised_covid19_vaccines.pdf), and the person has received the "dose(s) required" stipulated under the List. For any 2nd or 3rd dose received by the person in Hong Kong, eligibility for Vaccine Pass will be determined accordingly. A person who has received the Anhui Zhifei Longcom Biopharmaceutical, Bharat Biotech, the Gamaleya National Center of Epidemiology and Microbiology or Novavax (i.e. Nuvaxovid/Covovax) vaccines will be deemed to have completed the third dose under the Vaccine Pass requirements provided that the "dose(s) required" stipulated under the List has been satisfied.
- For a person who will turn 18, he/she will be given a 3-month window, counting from his/her 18th birthday, during which his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 12 to 17, and thereafter his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 18 or above.
- For a person who will turn 12, he/she will be given a 3-month window, counting from his/her 12th birthday, during which he/she will be exempted from Vaccine Pass requirements, and thereafter his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 12 to 17.
- Recovery is defined as 14 days after the date of the most recent documented positive test.
- The number of doses received before infection count only those doses received at least 14 days before the most recent documented positive test. In other words, a dose received within 14 days before the most recent documented positive test will not be counted as a dose received before infection.
